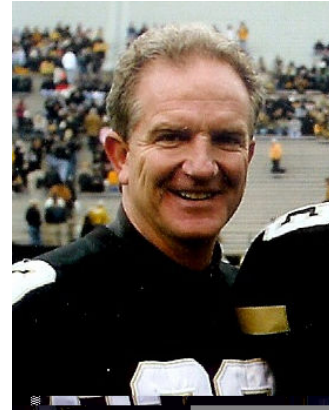


## Bill Allen 1972-1976



Bill Allen is a proud graduate of the 1976 class at Canal Winchester High School. During his high school years, Bill played Basketball for 2 years; Baseball for 3 years; and football for 4 years. He was a Varsity "W" member for 4 years. During his Baseball career, Bill was captain during the 1976 year, was All-Md State League First Team First Baseman, and won the Canal Winchester Booster Award. His coach was Denny Dickensheets. Bill received many awards in high school **Football**. He was Tri-Captain for his senior year, All-Md State League First-Team Offensive Tackle, All-District Offensive Tackle, and All-Ohio Offensive Tackle. During his junior and senior years, the team had undefeated seasons. Bill's senior year team was named the #1 Rated Team in the State of Ohio by U. P. I. and #2 Rated Team in the State of Ohio by A. P. The team was Md-State Champs, Scored 66 points (most in school history), only allowed 13 points (least points allowed in school history), recorded 8 Defensive Shutouts (most in school history). Bill's football career ended with a combined 4 year record of 3-6. Mike Locke was the coach.

Following high school, Bill attended Muskingum College and graduated in 1980 with a BA Degree in Communications and Journalism. During his freshman year, Bill played football as Offensive Guard. A knee surgery ended his career.

Currently, Bill is a Plant Manager for Teleflex, Inc in Sarasota Florida. His family consists of his wife of 25 years, Faith, a school teacher in Sarasota County, son, Brad (23), a 2008 graduate from Vanderbilt University, daughter, Jennie (20), a junior at the University of Florida; and daughter, Jillian (16), a junior at Menic High School whose mascot is also the Indians. They've lived in Florida for 14 years.
