Tamie Rawn attended Canal Winchester Schools all grades, playing varsity sports from 1977-1981. She lettered in four sports (volleyball, basketball, track and field and softball) earning a total of ten varsity letters.



Her favorite sport was basketball. Tamie was a member of three very successful teams which won three league titles and two district championships, accumulating a record of 68-6 throughout her varsity career. She was proud to be a member of the Canal Winchester basketball teams which took great pride in their academic excellence as well as teamwork and classy reputation on and off the court. She was voted Most Valuable Player, All-League and Honorable Mention All-Ohio her senior year.

Tamie also excelled in track and field and attributes much of her success to the great coaching and support she received over the years. Throwing the discus was her forte, finishing 8th at the state meet her junior year and state runnerup her senior year. Her record established as a result of her final throw at the state track meet her senior year still stands today. She also threw the shot put and in both events amassed many individual awards and as a result contributed to many successful team performances over the years. She was voted most Valuable Player, selected All-League and All-Ohio her senior year.

She was also a member of the varsity softball team her junior year and played two seasons of varsity volleyball. In volleyball, she was voted Most Valuable Player and Canal Winchester's Scholar Athlete her junior and senior years.

Tamie received the Mid-State League Scholar-Athlete award her junior year and The Agonis Club Outstanding Scholar-Athlete and Mabel Gale Scholar Athlete awards her senior year. Tamie was active in the marching band, the National Honor Society, Spanish Club and Fellowship of Christian Students. She went on to play basketball at Otterbein College, where she earned her Bachelor's Degree in Computer Science.

Tamie returned to Canal Winchester in 1986 to coach nine years of junior high volleyball and one year of junior high basketball. Her teams claimed a few championships along the way, but she had felt privileged to have great coaches throughout her high school years at CW and felt a sense of loyalty and tremendous pride returning to help carry on the traditions and give a little back.

Tamie is employed as a Computer Systems Manager at Nationwide Insurance and still enjoys participating and competing in many sports today. She also has been a lifelong member of St. Mary's Parish in Groveport.
